## **Harclerode honored for service to NCEES**

Howard C. (Skip) Harclerode II, P.E., of Phoenix, Maryland, has been awarded the NCEES Distinguished Service Award for his dedicated service to the engineering profession. NCEES recognized the 2010 award winners at its Annual Meeting, held August 18–21 in Denver.

Harclerode has been a member of the Maryland State Board for Professional Engineers since 2003. He is the current board chair, and he has served as board vice chair and as chair of the board's Complaint Committee during his tenure.

In addition to serving as the 2007–09 NCEES Northeast Zone assistant vice president, Harclerode has worked with a number of NCEES committees. He was a member of the Engineering Education Task Force from 2007 to 2010 and a member of the Committee on Uniform Procedures and Legislative Guidelines from 2004 to 2008. He served two terms as UPLG chair and later served as a consultant to UPLG from 2008 to 2010. He was also a member of the 2003–04 Fire Protection/Design-Build Task Force. For the past six years, Harclerode has worked with the PE Chemical exam development committee.

A strong supporter of the engineering profession, Harclerode has participated in numerous licensure presentations at student outreach events and recognition ceremonies for newly licensed professional engineers. He has also participated in ABET accreditation visits to Maryland universities.

Harclerode is a past national officer of the National Society of Professional Engineers and a former treasurer of the Maryland Society of Professional Engineers. He is a Fellow of NSPE and the American Institute of Chemical Engineers. He is a member of several other professional organizations, including the Order of the Engineer, the American Society of Safety Engineers, and the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers.
