Sack honored for service to NCEES

Theodore (Ted) A. Sack, P.L.S., of Tulsa, Oklahoma, has been awarded the NCEES Distinguished Service Award for his dedicated service to the engineering and surveying professions. NCEES recognized the 2010 award winners at its Annual Meeting, held August 18–21 in Denver.

A member of the Oklahoma State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors since 1997, Sack has served two terms each as board chair, vice chair, and secretary. He has also been a member of the board's Land Surveyor Continuing Education Committee for 13 years, serving the last 10 as chair.

Sack is the 2009–11 Southern Zone assistant vice president. A member of the NCEES Committee on Examinations for Professional Surveyors from 2007 to 2010, Sack has also served as a member of the Committee on Nominations and the Examination Administration Task Force and as a consultant to the Committee on Examinations for Professional Surveyors.

Sack has worked with the NCEES surveying exam development committee since 1999. He has assisted with item preparation for the Oklahoma land surveyor exam for 13 years, serving as committee chair for the last decade. He has also represented the Oklahoma board on ABET accreditation visits and at the American Congress on Surveying and Mapping Board Forums.

Sack has participated in licensure outreach meetings at Oklahoma universities and certificate presentation ceremonies for new professional engineers and land surveyors. He is a member and past president of the Oklahoma Society of Land Surveyors.
