## NCEES honors John Greenhalge for service

John Greenhalge, of Columbus, Ohio, has been awarded the NCEES Meritorious Service Award for his dedicated service to NCEES and the engineering and surveying professions. Greenhalge received this award at the organization's 98th annual meeting, held August 14–17, 2019, in Washington, D.C.

Originally appointed as board investigations supervisor in 1998, Greenhalge has served as executive director of the Ohio State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors since 2006.

His contributions to the board include developing and implementing a new-registrant program to advise new licensees of the requirements and responsibilities associated with licensure as a professional engineer or surveyor. He frequently gives presentations to Ohio engineering and surveying associations on licensing laws and rules, professional ethics, and the importance of licensure. He also speaks at Ohio colleges about the licensure process and the value of becoming licensed. He has developed a proactive enforcement program aimed at advising licensees and the public of Ohio's laws and rules governing the practice of engineering and surveying.

Greenhalge began his service to NCEES in 2006, when he was appointed to the Committee on Law Enforcement. He has served nine terms on the committee, including four as chair. He has also served three terms on the Committee on Member Board Administrators and was a member of the Leadership Task Force.

Greenhalge has taken part in numerous presentations on law enforcement and investigations training at NCEES annual meetings. He has been a devoted advocate of the NCEES Enforcement Exchange database, stressing its importance to protecting the public and improving license mobility.
